

INTERLIBRARY LOAN (ILL)

TÜBESS - National Document Supply Network

What is TÜBESS?

TÜBESS is Türkiye's National Document Supply Network, designed to support researchers by enabling access to academic materials that are not available in their home library. Through YÖK Thesis Center and the National Union Catalog (TO-KAT), libraries can share resources via photocopy or interlibrary loan. All requests are processed by the Document Supply Units of participating institutions.

Who can use TÜBESS at Biruni University?

All academic staff, administrative staff and students of Biruni University can benefit from this service. Requests can be sent directly to birunikutuphane@biruni.edu.tr.

What can you request?

You may request articles, books and theses. Due to copyright regulations, full photocopying of materials is not allowed.

If a thesis cannot be downloaded in full text from the YÖK Thesis Center -especially those written at other universities- it can be supplied through TÜBESS.

Important Note

Please do not request theses that are restricted by the author until a certain date. These cannot be provided through TÜBESS.

Biruni University's Interlibrary Loan (ILL) service plays a strategic role in expanding access to academic resources by supplying books, articles and other materials that are not available in our own collection. This service supports the research needs of faculty members as well as master's and doctoral students by partnering with other university libraries and ULAKBİM. Users can submit their requests to birunikutuphane@biruni.edu.tr, and complete citation details must be provided to ensure the request is processed accurately. Once the request reaches the library, the user is notified by email.

Users wishing to benefit from the ILL service must follow the steps below:

- First, search our library catalog to ensure that the requested material is not already available in our collection.
- Check the National Union Catalog (TO-KAT) to identify which university libraries in Türkiye hold the requested book.
- Verify the availability and loan status of the item directly from the catalog of the library where the source is located.
